



# 5 Ways to Love Your Traveling Man

4. Meals can be a lonely time when traveling, so try to find out where he will be eating - **call the restaurant and have them take a rose to his table or have them sing "Happy Birthday"** from you (even if it's not his birthday). He'll be thinking about you with a smile on his face the whole evening.
5. **Wrap a yellow ribbon around anything and everything he'll be using while he's gone.** Wrap it around his computer, his camera, his briefcase, his clothes, his shoes and his Bible. Remind him that you can't wait until he comes home.
